Introduction

- ► There are many scholarships available
- Access to scholarships typically depends on need and/or willingness to work hard to apply for many
- ► The organizations listed in this presentation are wellknown and not scams

First Things First: The FAFSA

- Fill out the FAFSA to access money from the federal government—specifically, the U.S. Department of Education—that helps you pay for college, career school, or graduate school expenses
- ► Complete <u>here</u> on October 1 for access to
 - ► Loans
 - ▶ Grants
 - ► Work Study (money is earned through a part-time job, not need to be repaid)
- Everyone should fill this out.
- ► It's better to have it an not need it than need it and not have it!

CSS Profile: The College Board

- ► The College Scholarship Service Profile (CSSS Profile) is a very in-depth form that permits college students to apply for non-federal, need-based financial aid
- ► About 200 undergraduate institutions use CSS Profile and/or IDOC as part of their financial aid process
 - e.g. UNC Chapel Hill, Duke, Notredame, UVA, NYU, Vanderbilt, Harvard
 - ► Click <u>here</u> for a full list
- CSS profile due date is institution dependent and may be required
- Available on October 1

Scholarships Tips

- ► While many colleges award merit and needs-based scholarships as part of the admissions process, other opportunities exist
- ▶ It is important to know that many are needs-based, but not all
- ▶ If you want to access scholarships, be prepared to:
 - Work hard
 - Read directions carefully
 - Note deadlines
 - ► Be strategic
 - ► Remain positive when faced with rejection
 - ► *NEVER* pay to apply for a scholarship
- Remember, every dollar counts!

Public Institutions: Non-Resident Scholarships

- ► Some state universities offer scholarships for non-residents that can bring the cost of attendance (COA) down
- e.g.
 - University of South Carolina
 - Miami University
 - ▶ University of Alabama
 - ► Florida State University
 - ► Louisiana State University
 - Colorado School of Mines

The National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators

- Most state education agencies have at least one grant or scholarship available to residents
- ► Some states have programs that allow residents to attend university in another state, without having to pay out-of-state tuition

The Foundation of the Carolinas

- Most Foundation For The Carolinas' Scholarship Funds use the online application
- Many are needs-based
- Scholarship funds may award grant to qualified students attending colleges and Important dates:
 - ► EARLY DECEMBER: New applications are available on our Online Scholarships System.
 - ► EARLY MARCH: Deadline to submit most applications to FFTC. Be sure to check specific scholarship deadlines

North Carolina Community Foundation

- Applications accepted starting in February
- Check back often for newly added opportunities
- Search for scholarships by county by clicking <u>here</u>
