MOVING PARTS.

Knock Knock. Who's there? Hopefully you big dog - it's opportunity calling! Your church family needs you - it takes a lot of moving parts to have

a vibrant church - which we so blessedly are. Let's talk about parts and systems.



When I was 14, I was old enough to drive the combine to harvest our corn and soybean acreage. The combine is a serious harvesting machine. Many, many moving parts. One drives the other using belts and pulleys and drive chains. Every one of those parts is vital to the overall function of this marvelous machine. Check out the picture.

You can't really see from the outside of this marvelous machine, but there are large hinged doors on the side of the combine for safety's sake. There are revolving cylinders set at precise clearances to perform certain tasks and shaking parts to separate the grain from the rest. There are large drive belts connecting with other drive trains to make this combine complete the task of taking in an ear of corn, stripping off the husk and discarding it, literally shaking out any dirt or debris until your are left with the clean corn being augered up into the storage bin on the top of the combine.

Why do I tell you this? Think of our church as I look at a combine - lots of moving parts which need to work together to accomplish our mission: The Global Methodist Church exists to make disciples of Jesus Christ and spread scriptural holiness across the globe.

Those drive belts can be compared to the people who are essential to the mission of Duck Church and are the primary drivers of our programs and ministries that we support with your contributions.

These are the budgeted ministries in the Duck Church 2025 budget and their amounts in parentheses:

- Heifer Project International (\$500) Ruthie's Kitchen (\$1,200)
- All God's Children Aulander (\$4,500)
- Beach Food Pantry (\$1,500) Caring Hands (\$2,000)
- Dare Challenge (\$2,000) Food for Thought (\$1,000)
- Interfaith Community Outreach (\$2,500,
- Room In the Inn (\$3,250) Children's Hospital of KD (\$1,500)
- Outer Banks Hotline (\$1,500) Samaritan's Purse (\$250)
- Outer Banks Relief Foundation (\$1,000)
- American Red Cross (\$2,000).

As a point of clarification, if you donate specifically to let's say the Food Pantry, the church forwards that money to the pantry - it is not used to satisfy the budgeted amount of \$1,500.

If you have any questions about our supported ministries, please contact me. As we roll into 2025, we're making some changes in our organizational structure and these ministries will be under the auspices of the Ministry Council.

Pray with me: We thank you God that you have blessed us with abundance which we will use to bless those in need in our community and the greater world. We ask for guidance and wisdom in carrying out our mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ.

Matthew 25: 37-40 - "Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?' And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'

Time to cowboy up and get to work. Amen? Amen.


